

Five Years of BER Facts & Figures

More than 100,000,000 passengers have travelled via BER in the past five years.

A total of more than **800,000 aircraft** movements (take-offs and landings) have taken place on both runways.

50,000,000 pieces of baggage have been handled at BER, including **750,000** oversized items.

The busiest travel day to date was 17 October 2025, with more than **100,000 passengers** for the first time.

54 percent of passengers travel to BER by public transport – more than half. *

The largest aircraft handled at BER was the **Antonov AN-124**, which transported turbines for Rolls-Royce in 2021.

A total of **56 countries** have been served by **103 airlines** so far.

59 percent of BER passengers live in Germany – including **35 percent** in Berlin and **7 percent** in Brandenburg.*

Since its introduction in February 2023, **20,000 sunflower lanyards** have been distributed free of charge at BER for people with non-visible disabilities.

57 percent of BER passengers travel alone. *

More than **20,000 people** work at the BER campus, including **2,000** employees of Flughafen Berlin Brandenburg GmbH.

There are **232 charging stations** for electric vehicles on the airport premises.

To improve energy efficiency, 40,000 LED lights have already been installed at BER.

22,161 applications for noise protection have been processed by FBB to date.

The noise protection zones around BER cover an area of 155 km².

34 aircraft noise monitoring stations measure noise levels along BER's flight paths around the clock.

24 film productions have already used BER as a filming location – including:
