



Both terminals are within walking distance of each other. Please find out in good time before your departure from which terminal you are flying.

# Orientation

# Terminals 1 and 2

At BER you can depart from and arrive at Terminal 1 (T1) or Terminal 2 (T2). T1 is the larger of the two BER terminals and offers a full range of services. Please find out which terminal you are flying from via our website, the BER app or through your airline. For departures, we recommend that our passengers arrive at the respective terminal at least 2.5 hours before takeoff.

If you are travelling to BER by public transport, you will arrive either at the station directly below T1 (Level U2) or at the approach in front of T1 (Level E0). The car parks and parking spaces are located at Airport City, directly in front of T1.

From there it is only a few minutes' walk to T2. First go to the arrivals level E0 in T1. The path to T2 is signposted from there.

# Getting to and from the airport

BER Airport can be reached quickly or conveniently by public transport and car.

#### By train

The airport railway station is located directly under Terminal 1. The Flughafen Express (Airport Express – FEX), regional trains and suburban trains run here several times an hour between Berlin city centre and BER as well as to Potsdam, Königs-Wusterhausen and Ludwigsfelde or Wünsdorf/Waldstadt. In addition, an Intercity train service connects BER with Rostock as well as Dresden and Chemnitz several times a day.

#### By bus

All public transport buses stop at bus stop A directly in front of Terminal 1. In addition to the express buses X7/X71 to Rudow underground station, the express bus BER2 runs to Potsdam. Services are complemented by other bus lines to Berlin and the surrounding area. Buses stop at bus stop B at Airport City.

#### With your own car

Detailed information on parking with your own car can be found in the next section.

### With a hire car

Car hire counters are located on the arrivals level E0 in T1. The car hire centre where you drop off/pick up your vehicle is located in car park P2, which is a few minutes' walk from T1.

#### With a car-sharing vehicle

You will find car-sharing providers' parking spaces in car park P4 at Airport City.

All multi-storey car parks are equipped with toilet facilities as well as bright staircases and lifts, which guarantee you an accessible arrival and departure. Baggage trolleys are available in car parks P4 and P6 and all multi-storey car park levels. There are monitors in the car parks with information on current departures and arrivals. You can charge your e-car in car park P8. Find out more on our website and book directly online.

# **Departures and arrivals**

At BER, you can depart from or arrive at Terminals 1 and 2. For departures, we recommend that our passengers arrive at the respective terminal at least 2.5 hours before takeoff.

You will find information on flights from seven days before your departure on our website or in the BER app.

# Check-in

If possible, check in online or at one of the numerous self-service machines in the terminals. In addition, some airlines offer check-in services on the evening before or bag drop for departures the following day. If you have already checked in online and are only travelling with carry-on baggage, you can go directly to one of the security controls.

Find out on our website whether you can check in and check in your baggage yourself at BER. Furthermore, you will find more important information about checking in there.

# Baggage

There are a few things to bear in mind when packing your suitcase. Make sure you find out about the regulations on carry-on baggage, checked baggage and bulky baggage

before your trip. At BER, more and more airlines allow you to check in your baggage yourself at designated counters. You can find more information about baggage on our website.

# Controls

There are many controls at an airport; these include security and carry-on baggage controls as well as customs and passport controls.

## Security control

Please go directly to security control after you have checked in. You can generally use any security control at BER in Terminals 1 and 2 to get to your departure gate. Information on current waiting times can be found on our website, in the BER app and on the monitors in the terminals.

#### BER Runway: Reserve a time slot

Reserving a time slot for access to security control saves waiting time. The service is free of charge and can be booked from seven days before departure. Passengers who have booked a time slot simply go to boarding pass control 4 in Terminal 1 with their boarding pass. This recognises when there is a reservation. Passengers can also reach Terminal 2 via Terminal 1.

### **Priority Lane**

Use the priority lane in front of security checkpoint 2 in Terminal 1, if your airline offers you access.

# ID and passport control

Before travelling, make sure you know which identity documents are required, regardless of your destination. An ID card is not always sufficient and other documents are required.

We recommend using EasyPass to get through passport control quickly and easily. Find out what requirements you have to meet on our website.

# **Customs check**

Customs administration monitors cross-border transportation of goods at the airport and levies customs duties or tax payments. Upon arrival, all goods that are subject to registration must be registered with Customs.
